1. Contributions made by IQAC in Curriculum Development, Teaching Learning Process and Evaluation: Curriculum was revised as per guidelines of as per statutory bodies and University. Syllabus revision was carried out for 10 programmes across all the faculties. Among all the faculties all courses are having focus on competency / employability / entrepreneurship / skill development. University has 70 National and 26 international MOUs. Total 47 programmes has been

implemented CBCS across all the faculties. Total 06 new degree programme, fellowship and diplomas introduced by the University. More number of interdisciplinary courses offered by the University. Total 40 value added courses offered during the year. Approximately 3700 students successfully completed value added coursed during the year. Total 564 students participated in the field visits. 173 community projects were completed by the students and faculty. Structure feedback mechanism adopted to collect data from every stack holder and analysis of obtained data had resulted in improvement in the quality of teaching learning process, mentorship support, utilization of upgraded facilities and the feedback received help to adopting necessary remedial measures for further improvement in quality of the process followed. Student's strength has increased from 3769 to 3925. Initiatives in teaching learning has enhanced the students' performance and average pass percentage of university was 97.47%. Total 15 Ph.D. was awarded during the academic year. Student demand ratio was 1:10. Total 211 students were admitted from other states and countries. Total 395 Special programmes were organized for advance learner and 635 programmes potential learner. Full time student's teacher ratio was 1:9. Total 1117 students are enrolled during the preceding academic year. Teaching experience of full time teachers is 14 years. Total 420 teachers were trained for development of e-content / e-courses / videos lectures and demonstrations. 41 full time teachers received awards and recognitions. Pass percentage of final years students is 97.47%. Total number of the outgoing students was 924/948. Total number of the students graduated from university were 1024. Online student satisfaction survey was conducted regarding teaching learning process, resulted in improvement in the quality of teaching learning process, mentorship support, utilization of upgraded facilities and the feedback received help for adopting necessary remedial measures for further improvement in quality. Regular Feedback Mechanisms: IQAC ensures that the curriculum is periodically updated based on feedback from stakeholders, including students, faculty, alumni and professional experts. This allows the university to align its academic offerings with the latest trends and emerging needs of various sectors. Integration of Interdisciplinary Approaches: The IQAC encourages the inclusion of interdisciplinary courses and programs to promote holistic development among students. This is done in consultation with various departments and in line with global educational trends. Academic Collaboration: IOAC facilitates collaborations with other universities and institutions to ensure that the curriculum is competitive and meets national and international standards. Adoption of Modern Teaching Methods: IQAC promotes the use of innovative teaching methods such as blended learning, e-learning, interactive

online platforms and the lecture capturing classrooms. This enhances the learning experience and encourages active participation. Regular Training Programs for Faculty: Continuous professional development programs for faculty members are conducted to improve teaching skills and incorporate modern pedagogical techniques into their teaching. Student-Centric Approaches: The IQAC emphasizes the importance of student-centric approaches like group discussions, case studies, role-playing and hands-on learning through practical's and fieldwork. Objective Evaluation Systems: A robust and transparent evaluation system, which includes formative and summative assessments, is promoted. This ensures fair, reliable, and timely evaluation of students' academic performance.

2. Contributions made by IQAC in Promoting Research, Innovations and Extension Research Centers and Funding: While comparing IPR achievements of the current academic year with previous academic years, it was observed that the current academic year has been reached to the greater extent with a significant difference. In case of granted patents and awarded design patents, the average number per annum has augmented from 44 to 76 per annum. The average number per annum of patent published 14 while awarded copyrights have increased from 81 to 296. 822 total number of publications published during the year. Impact of research promotion initiatives and efforts had made a significant impact which includes: provision of seed money more than Rs. 57.98 Lacks, Clinical trials - 12, Government projects - 09 and Non-Government Projects - 118. During the year 26 number of JRF, 21 number of SRF, 05 number of Research Associate and other research fellows has been enrolled. Total 08 Workshop / Seminars were conducted on intellectual property rights, Research methodology, Research grand writing and industry - academia collaborations. Total 12 awards/ recognitions received for innovations / discoveries. Number of startup incubates on campus was 02 and Technology Transfer was 01. Total 15 teachers received incentives for state / national / international recognitions and awards. Number of collaborative activities for research, student's exchange, faculty exchange and industry Internship was 54. Number of awards and recognitions received for extension and outreach activities was 27. University has 70 National and 26 International MOUs. IQAC has worked towards establishing specialized research centers and promoting the application for research grants from national and international agencies. Faculty and students are encouraged to pursue research in emerging areas of science, technology and social sciences. Organizing Conferences and Seminars: The IQAC plays a key role in organizing national and international conferences, workshops and seminars to facilitate the exchange of ideas, research findings and innovations. Industry Partnerships and

Innovations: The cell promotes collaboration between academia and industry, leading to innovations and practical applications of research. This collaboration helps bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and industry needs. Community Engagement and Extension Activities: IQAC encourages faculty and students to engage in community service through outreach programs, awareness campaigns and social initiatives, thus making education relevant to society.

3. Contributions made by IQAC in Infrastructure and Learning Resources and Student Support, Progression and Welfare: Number of Personal Computer increase from 720 to 813, Laptop 83 to 89, printers 373 to 416 and LCD Projector 115 to 118. Continuation of augmented teaching, learning, and infrastructure with ICT tools for interactive lectures and e-lectures and videos developed by faculty with the help of new lecture capturing system tools (imparts). Number of ICT tools 1436, Number of videos 10, Number of LCS 1104, Numbers of PPT on SAAKI 366 by the teachers. KVV (DU) library has 50148 books, 237 journals (National- 113, International- 124), 33817 e-books and 34852 e-journals. KVV (DU) has 1125 bedded multispatiality hospital. Total 1399 students benefited by scholarships, three student received from non - government agencies, 470 from government agencies and 926 students received from institution KVV (DU). 97 capability enchantment programmes, and skill development schemes are conducted during year. Total 3411 students were benefited by guidance for competitive examinations and career advancement. The institute has transparent mechanism for timely redressed of student grievances, prevention of sexual harassment and prevention of ragging. 211 students are qualifying in state, national and international level examinations. 507 students are placed and 228 students are progressed to higher education. Total 146 awards, medals received to the students for outstanding performance in sports and cultural activities. Total 89 awards in sports, and 57 in cultural activities and 14 State / Regional, 123 National, 9 International awards. Total 109 sports and cultural activates / events / competition were organized in the institutions during the year. All students, parents, alumni and teachers are registered on this platform. Its primary function is maintenance of student's records like attendance, performance, timetable, notices and circulars. The number of interdisciplinary courses in the year 2021-22 were 254 which increased to 287 in 2022-23 and 354 in the year 2023-24

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Krishna Vishwa Vidyapeeth (Deemed to be University) has successfully registered under the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) system (NAD ID: NAD014434), facilitating credit recognition and transfer for students. This initiative is designed to offer flexibility, allowing learners to benefit from multiple entries and exits during their academic programs. In addition, the university has adopted the Credit Framework for Online Learning Courses as per the SWAYAM Regulations (2021), enabling credit transfers from online courses. The National Service Scheme (NSS) has also been included as an elective in the CBCS curriculum to enhance student engagement and development. KVV has established over 11 international MOUs in alignment with UGC guidelines for the Internationalisation of Higher Education, promoting global collaborations. So far, 3231 students have opened accounts on DigiLocker, and a total of 1463 Degrees and 3872 Mark Sheets have been uploaded to the National Academic Depository (NAD) portal. This process is ongoing. The university regularly updating and ensuring that student's academic records are accessible and secure. These steps reflect KVV's commitment to providing a flexible, globally-connected education while ensuring transparency and easy access to academic credentials.

17.Skill development:

In this era of rapid change and technological advancements, Krishna Vishwa Vidyapeeth strives to equip learners with practical skills, enhancing their employability, fostering adaptability, promoting personal growth, and preparing them to succeed in a competitive landscape. All the courses in KVV focus on competency-based education and also clinical Skill training. added courses for we prepare the students to face the challenges in the real world. The university has initiates student inclusion in IKS by conducting regular workshops, seminars on the topics related to Indian Traditional knowledge systems. KVV will be developing digital repositories, online courses, of IKS to all the students .the university has created an inclusive environment by celebrating festivals of national integrity and cultural heredity. These activities will collectively contribute to the revitalization, preservation, and promotion of Indian knowledge system in coming future

It was planned to upgrade existing baseline question bank to Equestion bank. For this a committee is formed in each constituent faculty. Primary and secondary templates are preparedwhich are helpful in development and collection of subject wise and competency wise questions. Questions should be in the ratio of 1X10X3X (3 for LAQs,6 for SAQs,10 for MCQs)i.e. one question has to be ten times and 3 stands for three sets of question papers. The number in the bracket indicates that the questions should be three more times for LAQs,6 more times for SAQs and 10 more times for MCQs, and this will be implemented phase wise. All the questions are validated by external and internal experts. In online question paper setting, software is making the job of paper setting simpler and comparatively less error prone. Our objective is to update the comprehensive question bank that serves as robust resource, enabling efficient question formulation that is directly aligned with the intended learning outcomes.

For bertterment of PhD programme, reform in the form of implementation of "Mock open defense" before the final open defense is instuduced. Mock open defense is a replica of final open defense. Along with the examiners of Final open defense Mock examiners are deputed as observers for proper evaluation of the scholer and his research work.

The University has a robust and well-defined research promotion policy and guidance system, supported by a dedicated Directorate of Research. This directorate caters to the needs of undergraduate, postgraduate, PhD students, faculty, and other research scholars, ensuring they have the resources and support needed for quality research.

A Protocol Committee and registered Institutional Ethics Committee, guided by the Director of Research, oversee the research processes. Regular meetings are held by the Research Cell to evaluate the progress of ongoing research in the constituent institutions. The IPR policy ensures that innovative ideas are protected, recognizing and preserving their value. The Directorate of Research allocates sufficient funds to organize workshops that enhance participants' capacity in areas such as publication, IPR, technology transfer, and securing intellectual property rights. Income generated through royalties, license payments, and other IPR-related revenue is used to cover expenses associated with technology transfer and protective measures. The remaining income is then distributed based on predetermined criteria.

Royalties from patents or other intellectual property agreements are distributed according to the policies of KVV, Karad, with the prior

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approval of the IPR Cell Committee. In cases where multiple individuals are entitled to share royalty income but cannot reach an agreement, a written agreement must be submitted to the department or IPR office. If inventors are located at different locations, the income is distributed equally among them.

infrastructure. The University's NABH accredited teaching hospital is equipped with specialized classrooms along with a two-way audio-visual link to the operation theatres.

Facilities for Clinical Learning: The University's teaching hospital, boasting 1320 beds and providing ample clinical material. The University maintains international collaborations by monthly video-conferencing sessions with John Hopkins University in USA, focusing on HIV/AIDS.

Ayush-related therapy Centre: The University is commitment to holistic healthcare. Holistic education extends to its Ayurveda OPD and mind-body wellness clinic.

Laboratories & Museums: The laboratories are fitted with cuttingedge technology, designed to foster skill acquisition and learning across various discipline.

Skill and SIM Lab: The University's laboratories are staffed with highly trained faculty members who possess expertise in handling medical mannequins and simulation equipment.

Advanced research facilities: The University is commitment to improve the quality of the research. It is evident through its specialized laboratories dedicated to molecular biology, genetics, virology, and lead referral.

- Aerobic and Yoga Hall
- Swimming pool of International standard.

The provision of recreation rooms with various facilities in hostel buildings enhances the quality of student life and serves as a platform for organizing inter-university and inter-collegiate tournaments. These amenities contribute to the holistic development of students and promote a vibrant and inclusive campus environment.

Having three separate gymnasiums with reserved timings for female, caters to the diverse fitness needs of female students and faculty. The presence of yoga hall offers space for mental well-being. The large auditorium and Amphi theatre with a seating capacity of 1000 seats serves as a venue for various academic, cultural, and recreational events.

4.1.3 - Availability and adequacy of general campus facilities and overall ambience

The combination of necessary amenities like self-reliant facilities and robust security measures ensures that the campus environment remains a comfortable, secure and supportive for students and staff to thrive academically, professionally and personally.

The campus has 13 well equipped hostel buildings for students with all amenities. NABH accredited Krishna hospital has 1320 beds with 24x7 pharmacies. There are 3 Canteens, 1182 washrooms, 229 urinals and 1047 bathrooms including dedicated handicap friendly washrooms. The Krishna Sahakari Bank provides banking needs & ATM. The campus has a new Central Park constructed on a green hill. Green campus audit is conducted regularly and necessary changes are made accordingly. The campus has a newly built 3 floored parking lot, walking pathway, tactile pathway and water fountains. The campus has Waste Management facility for bio-medical waste. Recycled water is used for maintaining greenery in the campus. A total of 14 rain water harvesting sites collect 1,15,00,000 liters of water per year.

Along with the native flora (3096 trees) and fauna the institute also has toxicology garden. There is 900 KW on-grid solar plant which fulfils 40% electric requirements (10,41,224 KW) of the campus in addition to Central solar water-heater and heat pump with a capacity of 5000 lit/day.

Regulatory Requirements:

Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences is recognized by NMC with an undergraduate intake of 250 students per year. The hospital which is attached to the medical college, complies with all regulatory requisites regarding faculty, clinical resources, equipment etc.

Laboratory and Imaging:

Central Clinical Laboratory and Imaging Services have state-of-theart technology, such as CT, MRI and image intensifier, Mammography, Sonography, Color Doppler, ECG and EEG with latest technological innovations.

Clinical teaching-learning facilities:

All facilities like OPD, IPD, Museum, Library, Classrooms, Seminar halls and a Modern skill lab equipped with advanced mannequins are as per NMC regulations. Neurosurgery has three modular OTs with intraoperative CT installed.

Dental Hospital is well equipped as per DCI norms with Dental chairs, digital OPG machine, a skill lab, FastTrack Clinic and Implant clinic.

Faculty of Physiotherapy possesses state-of-the-art infrastructure including a dedicated OPD facility for students' clinical training.

The Faculty of Nursing Sciences, Pharmacy and Allied Sciences are well-equipped in accordance with the norms established by their respective regulatory bodies. Quality of clinical education is continually upgraded through improvements in equipment and infrastructure.

4.2.2 - Describe the adequacy of both outpatients and inpatients in the teaching hospital vis–a–vis the number of students trained and programmes offered (based on HIMS / EMR)

Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences admits annually 250 undergraduate, 126 postgraduate and 14 super-specialty students. The hospital has a significant daily influx of patients in both inpatient and outpatient departments. It provides ample facilities to meet the training needs of UG, PG and super-specialty students. It is equipped with lifesaving support amenities, intensive care units, a burns ward and emergency medicine services.

At any given time, over 80% of the hospital beds are occupied by patients. Average daily OPD attendance reaches 2420 patients. Both IPD and OPD patient numbers have shown consistent growth. The OPD has experienced a compounded annual growth rate of 7.68% while the IPD has grown at 5.8%.

Hospital successfully implements government schemes such as Maharashtra Police Kutumb Arogya Yojna, Ex-servicemen Contributory Health Scheme and Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Jan Arogya Yojana. Additionally, 10% of the beds are reserved for indigent patients and another 10% for weaker sections of society. Hospital has tie-ups with Multiple Insurance Companies.

The School of Dental Sciences with an undergraduate intake of 100 students and 23 postgraduate students fulfils the teaching and learning requirements. The clinical training facilities far exceed the Dental Council of India's requirements for high-quality training with average daily patient inflow surpassing 530 patients.

The collection of library books is available online through theweb OPAC facility. KOHA is a web-based integrated library system, capable of managing wide range of administrative processes. KOHA includes modules for acquisitions, circulation, cataloguing, serials management, authorities, reporting (flexible), label printing, multiformat notices, offline circulation even though when Internet access is not available.

Database of new books is maintained and regularly updated in the library after procuring new books, details such as Title, Author, Edition, Publisher etc. are also entered. Details of the borrowers are maintained with aid of the smartcard which contains photo I.D., name, address etc. Borrower receives the SMS before due date. KOHA software provides data regarding how many books have been returned on or before the due date, renewed etc. Library has recentlyinstalled 'digital attendance reader' module in the academic year 2023-24. Digital attendance reader reports faculty wise data of visitors status i.e. staff, U.G. students, P.G. students and Interns on daily, weekly, monthly and yearly basis.

KVV(DU) has comprehensive facilities for the management of both degradable and non-degradable waste, ensuring environmental sustainability and compliance with waste management regulations. Various wastes are gathered, separated and disposed in accordance with Maharashtra Pollution Control Board (MPCB) guidelines.

The hospital sends its biomedical waste to the "Karad Hospital Association," an MPCB-approved common biomedical waste treatment, storage and disposal facility. Non-hazardous waste is separated, dry waste is given to the municipal agency and organic waste is sent to an organic waste management facility. Every day, 300-400 kg of food waste are converted into about 80 kg of compost. E-waste in clearly labeled containers given to M/s. Electrofine Recycling (OPC) Private Limited for processing. On campus, there are two STPs installed, each with a 500 KLD capacity. The plant treats 700 KLD of liquid waste. After treatment, waste water is utilized for gardening. University has ETP with 100 KLD capacity which handles about 45 KLD of waste water from laundry and labs.

University has MOU with M/S Maharashtra Enviro Power Ltd. to eradicate the production of radioactive waste and infectious waste.

Through these facilities and initiatives, KVV(DU) strives to reduce waste generation, promote recycling and contribute to sustainable environment for all stakeholders.

It was planned to upgrade existing baseline question bank to Equestion bank. For this a committee is formed in each constituent faculty. Primary and secondary templates are preparedwhich are helpful in development and collection of subject wise and competency wise questions. Questions should be in the ratio of 1X10X3X (3 for LAQs,6 for SAQs,10 for MCQs)i.e. one question has to be ten times and 3 stands for three sets of question papers. The number in the bracket indicates that the questions should be three more times for LAQs,6 more times for SAQs and 10 more times for MCQs, and this will be implemented phase wise. All the questions are validated by external and internal experts. In online question paper setting, software is making the job of paper setting simpler and comparatively less error prone. Our objective is to update the comprehensive question bank that serves as robust resource, enabling efficient question formulation that is directly aligned with the intended learning outcomes.

For bertterment of PhD programme, reform in the form of implementation of "Mock open defense" before the final open defense is instuduced. Mock open defense is a replica of final open defense. Along with the examiners of Final open defense Mock examiners are deputed as observers for proper evaluation of the scholer and his research work.

The University has a robust and well-defined research promotion policy and guidance system, supported by a dedicated Directorate of Research. This directorate caters to the needs of undergraduate, postgraduate, PhD students, faculty, and other research scholars, ensuring they have the resources and support needed for quality research.

A Protocol Committee and registered Institutional Ethics Committee, guided by the Director of Research, oversee the research processes. Regular meetings are held by the Research Cell to evaluate the progress of ongoing research in the constituent institutions. Seed money is provided to researchers, with sufficient funds allocated in the university's budget to support this initiative. To further promote quality research, the Directorate of Research organizes workshops on research grant writing and paper publication counseling for PG and PhD students. Faculty members and students are incentivized to publish in quality and indexed journals.

The university is equipped with world-class laboratory equipment, including auto analyzers, and houses dedicated research labs. Additionally, the campus features an Animal House, Medicinal Plant Garden, Museum, and a Clinical Trial Centre to support and facilitate drug trial procedures. These partnerships create platforms for interactions, discussions on mutual interests, industry visits, and career guidance from industry professionals.

Additionally, a robust training and capacity-building program has been implemented to empower teachers, students, and staff to engage in consultancy activities effectively.

The IPR policy ensures that innovative ideas are protected,

recognizing and preserving their value. The Directorate of Research allocates sufficient funds to organize workshops that enhance participants' capacity in areas such as publication, IPR, technology transfer, and securing intellectual property rights. Income generated through royalties, license payments, and other IPR-related revenue is used to cover expenses associated with technology transfer and protective measures. The remaining income is then distributed based on predetermined criteria.

Royalties from patents or other intellectual property agreements are distributed according to the policies of KVV, Karad, with the prior approval of the IPR Cell Committee. In cases where multiple individuals are entitled to share royalty income but cannot reach an agreement, a written agreement must be submitted to the department or IPR office. If inventors are located at different locations, the income is distributed equally among them.

Facilities for Clinical Learning: The University's teaching hospital, boasting 1320 beds and providing ample clinical material. The University maintains international collaborations by monthly video-conferencing sessions with John Hopkins University in USA, focusing on HIV/AIDS.

Ayush-related therapy Centre: The University is commitment to holistic healthcare. Holistic education extends to its Ayurveda OPD and mind-body wellness clinic.

Laboratories & Museums: The laboratories are fitted with cuttingedge technology, designed to foster skill acquisition and learning across various discipline.

Skill and SIM Lab: The University's laboratories are staffed with highly trained faculty members who possess expertise in handling medical mannequins and simulation equipment.

Advanced research facilities: The University is commitment to improve the quality of the research. It is evident through its specialized laboratories dedicated to molecular biology, genetics, virology, and lead referral.

- Indoor sports complex with Table tennis and Badminton courts.
- Aerobic and Yoga Hall
- Swimming pool of International standard.

The provision of recreation rooms with various facilities in hostel buildings enhances the quality of student life and serves as a platform for organizing inter-university and inter-collegiate tournaments. These amenities contribute to the

holistic development of students and promote a vibrant and inclusive campus environment.

Having three separate gymnasiums with reserved timings for female, caters to the diverse fitness needs of female students and faculty. The presence of yoga hall offers space for mental well-being. The large auditorium and Amphi theatre with a seating capacity of 1000 seats serves as a venue for various academic, cultural, and recreational events.

4.1.3 - Availability and adequacy of general campus facilities and overall ambience

The combination of necessary amenities like self-reliant facilities and robust security measures ensures that the campus environment remains a comfortable, secure and supportive for students and staff to thrive academically, professionally and personally.

The campus has 13 well equipped hostel buildings for students with all amenities. NABH accredited Krishna hospital has 1320 beds with 24x7 pharmacies. There are 3 Canteens, 1182 washrooms, 229 urinals and 1047 bathrooms including dedicated handicap friendly washrooms. The Krishna Sahakari Bank provides banking needs & ATM. The campus has a new Central Park constructed on a green hill. Green campus audit is conducted regularly and necessary changes are made accordingly. The campus has a newly built 3 floored parking lot, walking pathway, tactile pathway and water fountains. The campus has Waste Management facility for biomedical waste. Recycled water is used for maintaining greenery in the campus. A total of 14 rain water harvesting sites collect 1,15,00,000 liters of water per year.

Along with the native flora (3096 trees) and fauna the institute also has toxicology garden. There is 900 KW on-grid solar plant which fulfils 40% electric requirements (10,41,224 KW) of the campus in addition to Central solar water-heater and heat pump

with a capacity of 5000 lit/day.

The Multi-Speciality Krishna Hospital and Medical Research Centre holds NABH accreditation and boasts cutting-edge infrastructure with a capacity of 1320 beds. It supports various innovative teaching programs of KVV (DU).

Regulatory Requirements:

Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences is recognized by NMC with an undergraduate intake of 250 students per year. The hospital

which is attached to the medical college, complies with all regulatory requisites regarding faculty, clinical resources, equipment etc.

Laboratory and Imaging:

Central Clinical Laboratory and Imaging Services have state-of-the-art technology, such as CT, MRI and image intensifier, Mammography, Sonography, Color Doppler, ECG and EEG with latest technological innovations.

Clinical teaching-learning facilities:

All facilities like OPD, IPD, Museum, Library, Classrooms, Seminar halls and a Modern skill lab equipped with advanced mannequins are as per NMC regulations. Neurosurgery has three modular OTs with intraoperative CT installed.

Dental Hospital is well equipped as per DCI norms with Dental chairs, digital OPG machine, a skill lab, FastTrack Clinic and Implant clinic.

Faculty of Physiotherapy possesses state-of-the-art infrastructure including a dedicated OPD facility for students' clinical training.

The Faculty of Nursing Sciences, Pharmacy and Allied Sciences are well-equipped in accordance with the norms established by their respective regulatory bodies. Quality of clinical education is continually upgraded through improvements in equipment and infrastructure.

4.2.2 - Describe the adequacy of both outpatients and inpatients in the teaching hospital vis—a–vis the number of students trained and programmes offered (based on HIMS / EMR)

Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences admits annually 250 undergraduate, 126 postgraduate and 14 super-specialty students. The hospital has a significant daily influx of patients in both inpatient and outpatient departments. It provides ample facilities to meet the training needs of UG, PG and super-specialty students. It is equipped with lifesaving support amenities, intensive care units, a burns ward and emergency medicine services.

At any given time, over 80% of the hospital beds are occupied by patients. Average daily OPD attendance reaches 2420 patients. Both IPD and OPD patient numbers have shown consistent growth. The OPD has experienced a compounded annual growth rate of 7.68% while the IPD has grown at 5.8%.

Hospital successfully implements government schemes such as Maharashtra Police Kutumb Arogya Yojna, Ex-servicemen Contributory Health Scheme and Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Jan Arogya Yojana. Additionally, 10% of the beds are reserved for indigent patients and another 10% for weaker sections of society. Hospital has tie-ups with Multiple Insurance Companies.

The School of Dental Sciences with an undergraduate intake of 100 students and 23 postgraduate students fulfils the teaching and learning requirements. The clinical training facilities far exceed the Dental Council of India's requirements for high-quality training with average daily patient inflow surpassing 530 patients.

KOHA includes modules for acquisitions, circulation, cataloguing, serials management, authorities, reporting (flexible), label printing, multi-format notices, offline circulation even though when Internet access is not available.

Database of new books is maintained and regularly updated in the library after procuring new books, details such as Title, Author, Edition, Publisher etc. are also entered. Details of the borrowers are maintained with aid of the smartcard which contains photo I.D., name, address etc. Borrower receives the SMS before due date. KOHA software provides data regarding how many books have been returned on or before the due date, renewed etc. Library has recentlyinstalled 'digital attendance reader' module in the academic year 2023-24. Digital attendance reader reports faculty wise data of visitors status i.e. staff, U.G. students, P.G. students and Interns on daily, weekly, monthly and yearly basis.

7.1.3 - Describe the facilities in the Institution for the management of the following types of degradable and non-degradable waste (within 100 - 200 words)

KVV(DU) has comprehensive facilities for the management of both degradable and non-degradable waste, ensuring environmental sustainability and compliance with waste management regulations. Various wastes are gathered, separated and disposed in accordance with Maharashtra Pollution Control Board (MPCB) guidelines.

The hospital sends its biomedical waste to the "Karad Hospital Association," an MPCB-approved common biomedical waste treatment, storage and disposal facility. Non-hazardous waste is separated, dry waste is given to the municipal agency and organic waste is sent to an organic waste management facility. Every day, 300-400 kg of food waste are converted into about 80 kg of compost. E-waste in clearly labeled containers given to M/s. Electrofine Recycling (OPC) Private Limited for processing. On campus, there are two STPs installed, each with a 500 KLD capacity. The plant treats 700 KLD of liquid waste. After treatment, waste water is utilized for gardening. University has ETP with 100 KLD capacity which handles about 45 KLD of waste water from laundry and labs.

University has MOU with M/S Maharashtra Enviro Power Ltd. to eradicate the production of radioactive waste and infectious waste.

Through these facilities and initiatives, KVV(DU) strives to reduce waste generation, promote recycling and contribute to sustainable environment for all stakeholders.
